1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I***
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS**, Born in Savannah, Georgia, Dr. Samuel V. Roundtree, the first of
4 five siblings, shares his life with his wife, Yolanda Ann Harris, and their daughter,
5 Scheherezade. Throughout his illustrious life and career he set many “firsts” for him
6 and his family. Dr. Roundtree's life is marked by a series of pioneering achievements.
7 He broke barriers as the first in his immediate family to attend college, the first to earn
8 four academic degrees, and the first African American to attain the position of Business
9 Director at NAVFAC Marianas. Notably, he was also the sole recipient of the
10 prestigious NAVFAC Peggy Craig Award for sustained superior government service;
11 and

12 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Roundtree prioritized education and understood the power of
13 knowledge and skill building. He studied Industrial Technology at Southern Illinois
14 University at Carbondale graduating with a Bachelor of Science, and received his
15 Masters of Administration, from Central Michigan University, and a Doctorate in

1 Organizational Leadership from Argosy University, Hawaii Campus. He was also
2 awarded an Associate of Applied Science in Aerospace Warning Technology from the
3 Community College of the Air Force; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Roundtree proudly served his country with distinction, retiring
5 as a Lieutenant Commander in the Supply Corps of the US Naval Reserve, marking the
6 end of a long and impactful military career. His Military Tours include Aerospace
7 Warning Systems Control Operator, US Air Force, from 1973 to 1979; Vehicle
8 Maintenance Analyst/ Maintenance Controller, US Air Force, from 1979 to 1981;
9 Aerospace Weapons Control Tech, Air National Guard, from 1984 to 1988; Supply
10 Division Officer, Naval Reserve (NR), Guam Unit 120, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces
11 Marianas from 1988 to 1992; Executive Officer NR, Naval Supply Depot, Pensacola,
12 Unit 108, from 1992 to 1994; Administrative Officer, NR, Volunteer Training Unit
13 (VTU) 3006G, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Marianas, from 1994 to 1997; Supply
14 Department Head, NR, VTU 3006G, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Marianas, from
15 1998 to 1999; Executive Officer, NR, VTU 3006G, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces
16 Marianas, from 1999 to 2002; Executive Officer, NR, VTU 3005G, Commander, Naval
17 Forces Japan, from 2002 to 2005; Headquarters Company Commander, Training
18 Assistance Group, 41st Combat Brigade, Operation Enduring Freedom, Kabul,
19 Afghanistan, from 2006 to 2007; Executive Officer, NR, Naval Base Support, Guam,
20 from 2007 to 2008; Commanding Officer, NR, Naval Base Support, Guam, from 2008
21 to 2009.; and

22 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Roundtree commitment to his country did not just end with his
23 service in the United States Armed Forces but continued afterwards in his civilian life
24 serving in the federal civil service for fifty-one (51) years with twenty-five (25) of those
25 years, directly contributing to the development and well-being of the island and its
26 people. Dr. Roundtree’s federal civil service career biography includes Business
27 Director, NAVFAC Marianas, from 2007 to Present; Business Manager, NAVFAC Far

1 East, from 2002 to 2007; Business Manager, Navy Public Works Center (PWC) Guam,
2 from 1999 to 2002; Transportation Department Head, PWC Guam, from 1997 to 1999;
3 Management Analysis Officer, PWC Guam, from 1994 to 1997; Management Analysis
4 Officer, PWC Jacksonville, from 1992 to 1994; Management Analysis Officer, PWC
5 Guam, from 1988 to 1992; Supervisory Management Analyst, Directorate of Resource
6 Management's (DRM) Army Performance Oriented Reviews and Standards (APORS),
7 Fort Stewart, Georgia, from 1986 to 1988; Management Analyst, DRM APORS, Fort
8 Stewart, Georgia, from 1986 to 1988; Senior Operations Analyst and Production
9 Controller, Naval Air Rework Facility, Alameda, from 1981 to 1984; and

10 **WHEREAS**, throughout his career he has been awarded multiple decorations
11 both in the military and federal service. His military decorations include the Meritorious
12 Service Medal Gold Star in lieu of second award, the Global War on Terrorism Medal,
13 the NATO Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, the Military Outstanding
14 Volunteer Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, the Navy Achievement
15 Medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal, the Air Force Good Conduct Medal, the
16 Army Commendation Medal, the National Defense Medal with Oak leaf, and the United
17 States Armed Forces Reserve Medal with "M" Device; and

18 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Roundtree's dedication to service extends beyond his
19 professional achievements, deeply rooted in a profound commitment to community
20 enrichment. He has consistently demonstrated a passion for uplifting others, serving as
21 a mentor and role model, particularly within underserved populations. His involvement
22 in numerous community initiatives reflects a genuine desire to foster positive change
23 and create opportunities for personal and collective growth. Dr. Roundtree understands
24 that true leadership is not confined to the workplace or military service; it is about
25 actively contributing to the betterment of society, ensuring that all individuals have the
26 chance to thrive. His unwavering commitment to community service serves as a

1 testament to his character, highlighting his belief that service to others is a fundamental
2 responsibility and a cornerstone of a meaningful life; now therefore, be it

3 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Ocho Na*
4 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
5 of Guam, recognizing and congratulating Dr. Samuel V. Roundtree on his retirement
6 from NAVFAC Marianas and commending him for outstanding fifty-one (51) years to
7 serving the United States Armed Forces and supporting the people of Guam; and be it
8 further

9 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
10 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
11 the same be thereafter transmitted to Dr. Samuel V. Roundtree; and to the Honorable
