II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION:

The public hearing for the appointment of began at **9:00 AM**

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Hafa Adai and good morning, everybody. Thank you for joining us today. Today's date is **August 11, 2026**. This morning's public hearing is held by the Committee on Education, Libraries, and Public Broadcasting. The time is now **9:01 AM**, and we'll call this hearing to order.

Before we begin, here are some housekeeping matters that we'll discuss. The First Notice of this public hearing was disseminated to all senators and media outlets on **August 4, 2026**, with the Second Notice disseminated on **August 9, 2026**. Notices of this hearing were also made available on Kandit News Group, the Guam Legislature's website, the Legislative Calendar, and the Government of Guam's Public Notice Portal. Today's public hearing is being broadcast live on the Guam Legislature's YouTube channel, and transcripts will be filed with the Committee on Rules and be made available on the Guam Legislature's website.

Today we'll hear testimony on:

There was another item on the agenda that we were supposed to hear but we postponed that because there were some technical corrections, and this was the teacher certification rules that was submitted by the GCEC. As of yesterday, the Compiler of Law sent it back asking for technical correction, so that was removed from the agenda and would be postponed to a later date, for those that were expecting to come today to speak on that.

According to the public hearing on Document 38GL-26-2454, again, that will be postponed so today we'll only proceed with the confirmation hearing for Mr. Christopher K. Felix. At this time, I'd like to welcome my colleagues who are joining us this morning, Senator Shawn Gumataotao, Senator Chris Dueñas, and Senator Telo Taitague.

Before we begin, I'd like to remind everybody in attendance of Liheslaturan Guåhan's General Rules of Conduct. Individuals testifying shall first be recognized by the chairperson before speaking and shall state their full name for the record. Questions and testimony shall be confined to the substance or nature of today's agenda. Personal inferences to the character or motive of any senator or individual testifying is not permitted. Pursuant to Section 11.07 of the 38th Guam Legislature standing rules, the chairperson may order the removal from the hearing of a committee or subcommittee of any person who is not a member of the legislature and who fails to observe proper decorum. Any violation of this general rule of conduct will result in immediate removal from this public hearing room.

With that said, we'll now proceed to hear testimony on the item on today's agenda, which is the appointment. Again, the Appointment of Christopher K. Felix, Member for the Board of Regents, University of Guam, six years from date of confirmation. At this time, we'll call those who are here to testify up to the table here.

I think the only one here to provide oral testimony is Dr. Enriquez. When you are ready, Madam President, thank you.

[START OF TESTIMONIES FOR APPOINTMENT OF CHRISTOPHER FELIX] [15:33]

DR. ANITA BORJA ENRIQUEZ, PRESIDENT, UNIVERSITY OF GUAM:

Buenas manana si Yu'os and Hafa Adai, dear Honorable Committee Chairman Borja and members of the Committee on Education, Libraries, and Public Broadcasting. Guaju si Anita Borja Enriquez. I am the President of the University of Guam, and I am very happy to support the nomination-appointment and confirmation of Mr. Christopher K. Felix.

On behalf of the University of Guam, Si Yu'os Ma'ase for this opportunity to submit our testimony in support of what we call the reappointment of Mr. Christopher Felix to the University of Guam Board of Regents for another six-year term. Former regent and Chairman Felix is no stranger to boards and commissions, especially to our University of Guam. He previously served a full six-year term on the Board of Regents from 2013 to 2019, serving as chairperson from 2018 to 2020.

He served on standing committees overseeing student affairs, fiscal facilities, investments, and budget, finance, and audit, including leadership roles as committee chair. During my time as senior vice president and provost, I worked very closely with the board on matters affecting our academic mission, institutional priorities, and students. And I observed firsthand Mr. Felix to be consistently engaged and attentive.

He listened carefully, asked thoughtful questions, and approached his responsibilities with data-informed policymaking, integrity, physical accountability, and sound judgment. Those who have served on the Board of Regents understand the significant time and commitment the role requires. Mr. Felix's willingness to serve again speaks volumes about his sense of public service and commitment, his desire to help Guam and our broader region based on our mission, and his steadfast support for higher education in general.

His experience and institutional knowledge would provide valuable continuity as the University of Guam advances student success, workforce development, and research in light of the major disruptions facing higher education across the nation. And so with his steadfast leadership, it is a breath of fresh air to add someone with his broad knowledge of real estate, property

management, anything to support the University's fiscal master plan intent as it relates to capital projects, deferred and preventative maintenance so vital to the operations of the institution and its long-term sustainability. So I respectfully support the reappointment of Mr. Felix and ask our honorable senators for your favorable consideration.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you, Madam President. Ma'am, if you can state your name for the record.

MS. DOMINIQUE FELIX, VP & ASSOCIATE BROKER-IN-CHARGE, CENTURY 21 REALTY MANAGEMENT COMPANY, INC.:

Hafa adai and good morning, my name is Dominique Rose Felix. I am the daughter of Christopher K. Felix, and I am actually reading a letter testimony on behalf of Clare Delgado, who is the president of the Guam Association of Realtors and the Principal Broker of Home Ventures Realty.

“Hafa adai Senator Borja, I am respectfully submitting my written testimony in support for Christopher K. Felix to serve as a member of the Board of Regents of the University of Guam, pursuant to Doc. No. 38, GL-26-2472.

I have known Chris for close to 20 years, and over the years I have had the pleasure of working with him in the following capacities of real estate transactions, board member with the Guam Association of Realtors, and a committee member with the National Association of Realtors.

Chris is an individual of integrity and honesty. He has consistently demonstrated responsibility, professionalism, and a genuine commitment to serving others. He approaches everything given to him with diligence, and he maintains a positive attitude even when he is faced with challenges or criticism.

Chris is also very generous with his time. An example of this is him reaching out to me when I first started my real estate career to offer help if ever I needed it. We did not work in the same office, and by any other standard, we are considered competitors. But Chris did not hesitate to say “call me if you need me,” and he meant it. I certainly call on him even now if I ever need advice or just someone to run an idea by. He always answers my call. It's because of this example I, in turn, don't hesitate to help others in need or return a call. It's a pay it forward debt I'm happy to oblige. This is just the kind of person Chris is. He is a mentor to many, and certainly a mentor of mine.

Chris has always stressed the importance of education. He has volunteered his time to teach real estate courses for the Guam Association of Realtors many times, and many still look to him as an inspiration for learning more.

Thank you for the opportunity of providing my support for Chris. Chris is a colleague, a mentor, a fellow broker, and most of all, my dear friend. I feel lucky to know him, and the University of Guam's Board of Regents and students will be lucky to maintain Chris as a member.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you. Dr. McNich.

DR. RONALD McNINCH, GUAM EDUCATION BOARD MEMBER:

Thank you, Senator Borja and senators. My name is Ron McNich. I'm an associate professor at the University of Guam, also I'm chair of public administration legal studies. Also, I'm on the GDOE board, and I'll mention that part in just a second.

I would like to kindly mention I did send in some written support for Chris Felix. I've known him for nearly 30 years. He's been my realtor, and also I've known him through the Guam Rotary Club, and he's also been an excellent rotarian and community stakeholder. He's genuinely involved in our community in ways that really make a difference, and that's quite refreshing to know. So I've known him. He's done well as a former regent, and I fully support him, absolutely.

One other thing I'd like to kindly note, back in 2018, Chris Felix was only one of the two regents that voted for Dr. Anita to be president, and he made the right choice. And I always joke with him about that when I see him, and remind him that he really follows what our community needs as a regent, and I always appreciate that.

In general, we have a lot of good regents on the Board of Regents. They are active. They are involved. One thing that the legislature might consider in the future is to revise the appointment process for regents. Former regents should not have to go through an internal check process as long as they're in good standing. That's an example.

The other thing is the largest section of the Guam Code for the University of Guam Charter is on this really complicated regent selection process. It could be greatly simplified and streamlined in my view, and I'd just like to kindly suggest that the appointing authority, that is to say the Governor, should be the primary point of consideration, not an internal stakeholder process that we currently use. WASP was critical of this when this proposal was first made, and now might be the time to revisit in the next year or so.

Regents at the University of Guam meet four times a year. In my constructive opinion, they should meet more. They should meet six to eight times a year. They do have side meetings, but

they need to interface with the public a little bit more, in my opinion, and I mean that just constructively. Also under 17 GCA 16A, there is a “joint board” that is inactive, but it's a great board because it involves both GDOE, Guam Community College, and the University of Guam, and we can make joint policies that can really fix some things of our mutual interest. And I would like to kindly suggest those present who have a role in this to consider the value of that existing law for those existing purposes.

Finally, ladies and gentlemen, I'd just like to kindly suggest, as academics and as a university, we produce a lot of data at the university. We have a UOG fact book. Making our decisions based upon data, and hiring people who understand data, and who are willing to stand up and use data to make good decisions is really what we need. I know Mr. Felix will use data, and I just want to reinforce to use data whenever you can as a decision maker and policymaker.

Ladies and gentlemen, thank you so much, and I appreciate the opportunity to speak today.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you, Dr. McNich. Mr. Felix, you may say thank you.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

Thank you, Chair Senator Borja. Senators, thank you. I think you all know me. I have been on Guam for 54 years now. Born and raised in Hawaii, so I'm just an island boy who moved to a better island. That's the way I've always looked at it.

This is my home, has been my home for many, many years. I have been active in many, many different community projects and things, but I think one of the hardest and best was when I was a regent for the university. It was a very tough six years. We did a lot during that time, and I learned a lot. I may be stupid for asking to serve another six years, but I am more than willing. If Anita needs me, I'm there for her.

I'm very proud to serve and be a member of our Board of Regents if the legislature so chooses. That's about it, senators.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you, Mr. Felix, and thank you, everybody, for your testimony. We'll go ahead and open up the panel for questions, and we'll go ahead and start with Senator Taitague.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE:

Si Yu'os ma'åse Mr. Chair. Good morning to my colleagues, and especially good morning to everyone who's here with us for this confirmation hearing. And those who are listening on air, good morning, as well.

I don't know how many times I've been to your confirmation hearings throughout the years. Just the willingness, and now having your daughter here makes it a little bit more special because knowing that you've got the backer to do this, that's comforting. It's always a family that gives you that moral support and push and keeps you on the street and narrow, too. But taking time away from your job, and I know you're a super busy person, as well as family, to serve the people of Guam, is commendable and admirable. And I thank you so much for stepping up to the plate to give back to the best island there is. So I appreciate that.

But, you know, in your capacity, sitting on this Board of Regents, there's a lot going on. We're seeing nationwide, in the region, a decline of student enrollment in universities. We're seeing that. We're seeing new technology, which I'm very happy that Dr. Enriquez has incorporated STEM, as well as AI and environmental research that is also going on at the University of Guam and integrating that safely. She sits on the AI task force. So I appreciate that. Thank you, Dr. Enriquez, for your time on the AI task force.

But, you know, it also has some areas in which it can be very uncomfortable. And Chris, you've been in situations where if there were hard questions to ask, I don't think you have an issue asking the tough questions. And I don't see you turning a blind eye either, you know. I think you have the foresight and understanding to make decisions not just today, but also in the future. And that comes with also your important position as an evaluator for the president.

So my question is, please feel free to jump from one to another. One, how are you going to be very evaluating the president? How do you go about doing that and keeping that distance between your friendship and then what is in the best interest of the University of Guam? Safety within the University of Guam is also very important. A lot of people tend to never even ask that question about the safety of the University of Guam in every aspect. And lastly, the issue with student enrollment declining and how are you going to address that?

So there's a few things you can please have at it. If you can't remember what I said, some of the stuff I said, I'll be glad to help you, but please.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

Well, I guess on number one, I think President Anita knows me well enough to know I have no problem sitting down and telling her what I think and what I feel and where I'm at. I've never had a problem talking to her very frankly about anything that's come. You know, this is Guam. We're all friends, unfortunately. We all become friends or we become enemies. There's no two ways about it. President Anita and I are friends and have been for a long time, but I'm not letting that come between us.

As far as safety is concerned, in my last regency, I noticed, and I still notice, we need some more of that. Personally, I want to see some. They have in the states, these “blue lights,” centers and places where a person can go if they feel uncomfortable, push a light and security can return immediately. That's pretty well established throughout the United States. I'd like to see Guam beef that up a little bit and strengthen that. That has always been one of my concerns on safety. The new buildings we built meet code and I think we're pretty well established as far as that type of safety. And then I'm sorry, your last question. I did two out of three. That's as good as I can get.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE:

You still got it. You still got it. The other one was student decline and how are you going to balance that based on your finances. Now, I don't know if you heard, but it is the first time in history that we've had to bail out of the airport because of the situation, and they are self sufficient. I mean, we, still as a legislature, fund the University of Guam, but we're starting to see decline in student enrollment. And then we're still seeing things built at the University of Guam.

And of course, technology plays a great part in subsidizing certain areas where it's more cost efficient to go this route. Our students are finding that for them, it's easier to go online for these studies because they save on gas, transportation. They go from working a job and then having to leave their job in the afternoon to run to school, take a class there, then go back to their job. You know, convenience is not just convenience, but it's cost-saving measures, too, that help these students. So you're looking at a decline in students at the University of Guam. So how are we going to address that and meet that same financial stability that the university can have without coming to the legislature? And also, can you add in the tuition? What's the possibility of tuition going up this year?

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

That I have no idea about tuition. I haven't looked at the numbers of the university. I was part of the last tuition raise and got yelled at at public hearings. I've had to face some music on that. It was something that had to be done. Our tuition has always been fairly low and reasonable. Scholarships are available and I'd like to try to build a little more personally, like our nursing program. We're only graduating 30 to 35 nurses a year. I'd like to focus on trying to increase that. I know a lot of people, a lot of my relatives, nieces and nephews, have left Guam to attend nursing schools elsewhere because they weren't accepted at the University of Guam. And I think it's time we revisit that and try to open up. Our School of Engineering, also I'm so proud of that. I was a part originally of that. And we've got a long way to go with that. I'd like to develop these schools and try to increase, I mean, education, nursing and engineering. There's a strong need for that.

And there's no need to go off-island for that anymore. Also, the cost of going off-island and schooling is absolutely outrageous. I sent 3 daughters. I'm not looking at anyone in particular to off-island universities. And it is very frightening and expensive. And I don't see why we can't try to build that up more on Guam. There's no need to send your kids off-island. We offer as good or better than what you can get anywhere else. And a good, solid education. I've always been in favor. I hope that answers your questions.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE:

Kind of. We're still dealing with the decline in student ratio versus the cost of the university. And I hope you look into that. I really do. I know that you're a good and honest man. Moving forward, transparency, accountability is always the foundation on anything that you do that would give comfort to the people of Guam. And knowing that you're very open in that perspective on transparency. So, Mr. Chair, I thank you for the opportunity.

And, Chris, it's very rare that I mention anybody, whether they have my support or not, during a public hearing. But I've known you for years. I've been in this position in front of you for years. And this time, I will say, you have my support. And I thank your family, too, for allowing him to continue to serve the people of Guam because that's what he does best. He's a good servant. Thank you. Mr. Chair.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you, Senator Taitague. Senator Gumataotao, you are recognized.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

Thank you, Mr. Chair. And thank you, Chris. You're not stupid for wanting to step up and do this job one more time. Because I remember back when you took the first appointment back in 2013. I was just starting as an adjunct at the University of Guam. I was probably wondering what the heck I was doing considering doing it.

But I would say that it's been one of the most enjoyable parts of, I guess, in my third or fourth career to be a part of the UOG family. I haven't done it in over a year because I do have another gig that I'm actually doing right now, so I can't get back on campus. And maybe we need to change the laws to allow maybe more people to do it.

But I wanted to ask you, importantly, when I think of your appointment, is it because of your real estate background? Because I think that the university has a large campus. There's a lot of exciting things happening. Are we deferring to your real estate experience, perhaps to look at all the real estate at the university campus on the island? And maybe there's opportunities to maybe expand and help our students.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

My first term, my first six years, a lot of my time was spent as a member of facilities. I chaired that, I think, for one year and served under Gail, for a while, Elizabeth Gail, for a number of years on that committee. It's a very important committee.

With my background in real estate development, property management, and maintenance, I bring that to look at the costs we're going through and hopefully keep that reduced or down. To know when to contract out a service and when to bring it in-house and not be afraid to do either one I think is critical, and that's what I originally brought and that's what we discussed many times in the years. I think my real estate background, of course, brings that. My caring and my love of education brings others.

The only committee I feel I failed in was the finance committee because when they start throwing out numbers and stuff, I do get a little lost. I can follow along and understand enough and I know what numbers we are facing as far as finance and stuff, but that's my one committee that I think I was weakest in. But all the others, I chaired SASR, that committee for two years and enjoyed it thoroughly. That was the scholarship committee, and so I worked hard on that. So I think I bring a lot, pretty well-rounded.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

You know, speaking of real estate, our on-campus housing for our students at the university, it could be a potential revenue-generating source, not just during the academic year, Chris, but during the summertime. There's a lot of programs that are looking for alternatives for housing. What's your general take on the expansion of residential housing for students at the university?

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

Well, unfortunately, our existing housing is not very good. When I was there, we talked about an international dorm to be developed kind of across from the School of Business. We were looking at plans on that, and I think it's a matter of financing. But that's what we need, I believe, is a decent dorm, a more modern dorm, not this "room, room, room, and bathroom at the end of the hallway." That stuff is gone. It was gone when I was going to college here.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

Oh, come on. I mean, I had the same thing when I was in school. Nothing wrong with going down the hall to use a bathroom and other stuff like that. But I mean, I think that's an important distinction. Sometimes I think we're kind of a commuter school, if you will. And I mean, I had a lot of students who were having a hard time battling traffic to get there. And some of them, they actually lived on Guam, and they were fighting to get on campus because they knew that it was always a struggle. So I'm hoping that as your time on the Board of Regents, you'll look at perhaps the residence halls as a way to address that.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

I worked with people from Saipan and families that actually bought condominiums or rented condominiums just off campus in the McNeilow area for their children to go. So yeah, we need to work on that. I think it's an excellent source of income and a source of pride to have a real upscale. And then we can be talking not just of Micronesia, but we can be talking of Asia, summer schools and programs coming in from Japan or Korea. I think we talked about that, and we need to work on that.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

No, exactly. And I'm not trying to impede your business by having you work on campus, but I think you made a good point that there is opportunity, and I'm hoping that as you get on that you better do that. I only have one last question, because I think when we think of the enrollment numbers at the University of Guam, I mean, much of it has a lot to do with COVID. I mean, I was probably one of the first instructors on campus, and I know that Dr. Bamba would probably agree. I had to wear a mask. We had filters, but it was trying to get people back on campus. And I think that we're still probably not out of the woods.

What do you foresee in your role on how we can expand further student services so we can really, well, attract them but also keep them on campus?

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

I don't know. To be very frank, we need to work on that. To be very frank, we need to get in there and study. I mean, you've got to be real. Our economy is, I mean, we're really in the tubes. I mean, our tourism, our military, losing Okinawa, how that's going to affect Guam over the next five, ten years, how is that going to affect the University of Guam, you know, economically? You know, we have to figure out where we stand, where we're going to be, and then face those questions and solve those problems.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

You know, I'm a little bit more of an optimist. I believe that the University of Guam provides such an absolute opportunity for young people to get educated. And yes, they don't have to leave off-island. I have four daughters myself. I wish that, you know, one is considering where to go next, but I would hope that when people do leave, if they do, to come back and look at the graduate programs, the School of Engineering. I mean, we're seeing such a large expansion that there is such a target-rich environment to bring our people back to the University of Guam.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

Totally agree. I have, like I said, I have nephews and nieces now who have graduated from the university that I'm proud of. One of them just got her doctorate, and all through UOG or

off-campus, I'm just, you know, that's something to be proud of, that we're heading in the right direction.

SENATOR EULOGIO SHAWN GUMATAOTAO, MEMBER:

No, absolutely, Chris. And listen, I do appreciate you stepping forward to once again serve the University of Guam on the regents, and you can expect when we do get your appointment, and it gets to the floor, that I will be voting in the affirmative for your confirmation.

So again, thank you so much, Chris, for all that you do for the people of Guam. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

SENATOR VINCENT ANTHONY V. BORJA, CHAIRPERSON:

Thank you, Senator Gumataotao. Senator Dueñas.

SENATOR CHRISTOPHER DUEÑAS, MEMBER:

Si Yu'os Ma'ase, Mr. Chair, and thank you, Chris Felix, for coming down and accepting the appointment and going through the rigorous process, as Dr. Anita mentioned, to get to this point. I'm excited, absolutely excited, on your return. And I wanted to tell your daughter, because I'm sure she was busy reading the testimony, that when you introduce yourself as his daughter, he went like this, like he just saw a touchdown in a football game. So that's how much he loves you and appreciates you being here.

I also want to thank the Guam Association of Realtors for their endorsement of you. One thing about that fine organization is that when they look towards the community and ask leaders tough questions, they're not just talking about real estate, they're talking about quality of life across the board. And I think that that's why you're going to be an invaluable asset, once again, to the board, Chris.

I wanted to mention that while there is discussions on declining enrollment, actually for 24-25, there's modest increase of 9 pupils, but it's moving in the right direction, as well as I think you'll be excited when you return to maybe taking a tour that the nursing program has expanded exponentially now, and I think that they've answered the call to that expansion in terms of the need, as well as, like you said, the engineering school. You know, Chris, what I want to ask you for, because I think you know operationally, and you'll be happy also to know that they're budgeting greatly for maintenance and upkeep of not only their current facilities, but the new facilities they've brought on board. This legislature has recognized that, and we know that it's a premier institution, and we want to keep it that way.

I think, really, it comes down to marketing, and that's what you do best a lot in the work and area you do. I am a big cheerleader for getting into the schools, again, as many times as we can in our

feeder schools. We know that the school system, as well, is a declining population, so we've got to get more of those kids who are university bound and excited about UOG and bringing them in.

So I just want to ask you, if you concur, I think it really is more marketing our premier workforce development institution to our feeder schools and working harder on that area.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

I totally agree with you. We've got to get out there. I think the best way to market is to show the people who have gone through the system, our graduates and what they've done, and you know, just spotlight here and there. I think that's the way to do it. You know, Facebook and social media is just kind of a neat hit. You know, throw those things out and just get individuals out there of what they've done and who they are.

SENATOR CHRISTOPHER DUEÑAS, MEMBER:

Another thing is there's been renewed activism from the Chamber of Commerce, and we all know that they make up 90 percent of small businesses on Guam. You know, they've been kind of targeted as being some big business entity group that takes care of only the big guys. I don't see that. I see a lot of small, hardworking businesses in there that are interested once again in engaging with our government and how we manage our resources.

And also, see, I take a different approach. I think really by working with the business community, what we're doing is creating the environment for advancement of our businesses, growth of our economy, which are the fundamentals to bringing in more resources for the government. Do you see it that way? And maybe the board goes out also and engages once again closely with the private sector on exactly the demand-driven jobs and businesses that the university can grow and expand.

MR. CHRISTOPHER K. FELIX, NOMINEE:

My company has been a member of the Chamber since I formed it. I've been a director of the Chamber for, I think, nine years. I'm a firm believer there's time to step off and let new blood take over. I'm a believer in that. So that's what I did and haven't been on the board in a while. I think about eight, nine years now. But there was a fear in the past of the Chamber being kind of controlled by some of the heavy hitters. That's gone. It really has.

You're right, Senator. It is an infusion. If you look at the board and you look at what they're doing, it's a beautiful blend of mid-size and small businesses trying to stay alive and trying to do what's right for their community and for their business and fighting hard at times and fighting soft at other times. But it's a good blend. And I'm very proud to be a member of the Chamber, have been 45 years, I think. And before that, when I was Calvo Management, we were members of the Chamber. So over 50 years, I've been a part of the Chamber.

SENATOR CHRISTOPHER DUEÑAS, MEMBER:

So, yeah, Chris, once again, you have my full support. My challenge here, and I'm going to ask, actually, if I can, Mr. Chair, just for the president to just do a quick update again on the efforts. But I also want to engage you in this. I think we cannot do this enough in terms of making sure that we understand. I am a firm believer in University of Guam as being the premier institution of workforce development alongside GCC and Trades Academy as really the trinity of workforce development. But in terms of business center, all the other things at the university, I want to challenge you again to engage and expand engagement once again with the Chamber and others to really understand how we need to develop quickly and rebuild our business sector. And I think that you have the ability to bring in that new blood and groom that new blood.

Chris, you got my support. Anita, would you like to share a little bit with that?

DR. ANITA BORJA ENRIQUEZ, PRESIDENT, UNIVERSITY OF GUAM:

Absolutely. For us, in order to survive in the most challenging period ever that institutions of higher education universities and colleges are facing, the dwindling of federal research grant money out of Washington, D.C., the threat to accreditation, high quality standards, of course, the out-migration of families from Guam, especially we're cognizant of that, the reduction of the student population of the Guam Department of Education, the proliferation of the many different charter schools that are present.

I feel that there's still a lot of research to be done with regard to what's happening, where are the students going, what is happening with regard to the number of families leaving. They continue to leave. My niece and her five children and husband are leaving in a few weeks. My sister has sold her home, and she is leaving, and it's very disheartening. But at the same time, I feel as stewards of the University of Guam, we want to ensure that the university is sustained for future generations, and we think about our great-great-great-great-great-grandchildren, grand-nieces, grand-nephews, friends of their respective lineage moving forward, that we want to ensure that the university remains a high-quality, long-term, sustainable institution that is intent on building up the professional workforce, the intellectual capacity in providing the necessary subject matter experts.

So as you mentioned, Senator Dueñas, the nursing program has expanded to 60 majors with a new nursing hub opening up tomorrow morning. We are excited because for the first time ever, we were able to admit 45 new majors, and we still had 15 slots open. Because of the rigorous prerequisites of a nursing major, although there's a lot of passion among our youth who are interested in becoming nurses, it is highly competitive, just like pursuing medical school. It is highly competitive, and when you're grooming professionals who are going to be engaging in life and death experiences, we want to make sure that they are well, well trained.

And so we do have a relationship with the Guam Community College. We have a relationship with the GCA Trade Academy. Dr. Burke Johnson and I have decided we're going to meet regularly. We do have a number of articulation agreements, not only with the Guam Community College, but across the two-year colleges in Micronesia, Palau, RMI, CNMI, FSM, and already we have been invited to offer two degree programs in Palau. We graduated 20 Special Ed professionals in Palau last year. We graduated a cohort of students in the MPA program in Saipan. Tinian has asked us for a fully online MPA program. We are responding where there's a need. With the Colorado School of Mines, having a footprint in our Mangilao campus, we will be offering an articulation pathway to mechanical engineering, advanced manufacturing.

We are exploring other avenues. I'm going to have breakfast with soon-to-be Regent Felix to give him an update. We have a new master's degree in data science, an online master of accountancy, a fully online doctorate of education. We are innovating. My plan is to bring in an AI robotics track into the University of Guam. Every single student is required to know AI and also cybersecurity.

We are intent on ensuring that the type of workforce that we are building is very responsive to all the different sectors on our island. With regard to building up businesses, we still have the Guam Small Business Development Center. We also have the Apex Accelerator that used to be called the Guam Procurement Technical Assistance Center to allow our local businesses to get the necessary certifications to compete in the federal marketplace. As of a few years ago, we were successful in enabling our small business clients to be able to attain over \$30 million in awards. So that's the kind of promise, that's the kind of initiative, in addition to many ways in which we can bring in our international students.

The dormitory issue is brought up. It is always full. Across the summer, we bring in our international students under the English Adventure Program. It is always full. There is no issue. Regent Felix, for the first time, we've gone from being in the red for the dormitories and we have been in the black for a number of years. So it is considered not just a student support venue, but also an auxiliary unit that is intent to be more of, not a primarily cost center, but a revenue enhancement center to help with the operational needs of the University of Guam.

So there's a lot going on. We're so proud. I'm so proud of where we've become, and we want to ensure that the University of Guam continues to be relevant. We've increased the number of online courses. I believe we have almost 300. We've increased the number of fully degree programs online. We have a center for online learning that has the high-quality, wraparound ecosystem of support to ensure that we are also going to be focusing on stackable credentials, certificate offerings, three-year degree programs, the possibility of offering a, what I call a

Toulouse-Montana dual enrollment scholarship to high school students, tuition-free. So more to follow on that. Many ways in which we are trying to grow enrollment numbers.

Enrollment has, because of the pandemic, it did decline, but we've been able to grow that back, and it continues to grow. But be ever mindful that our students come to us, not just for the degree, but also as a stepping stone. They want to be physicians. They want to be scientists. They want to be psychologists. They want to be physical therapists. They want to be pharmacists. We are the stepping stone. We are getting the valedictorians. This is the salutatorians, students from St. John's, students from the Ivy League high schools from across the region. We are an attractive destination for students from Taiwan and from different parts of our broader region.

So I am significantly proud, and I know that after I get our soon-to-returning region back to speed, I think you'll be totally blown away with what we have achieved thus far and what we'll continue to achieve moving forward. I hope that answers your question.

SENATOR CHRISTOPHER DUEÑAS, MEMBER:

In droves, and that's why I am an unashamed scar on my back, supporter of your budget. I have constraints in the government, no question about it. I hate to put this tag on, but it's something that we all understand. It's not a downgrade term, but the return on investment is immense. And the bottom line is, you're a CEO, Chris, and so I say, put aside time for brunch maybe, not lunch, because you're probably going to have to have a couple hours for that.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and certainly you have my full support, Mr. Felix.
