



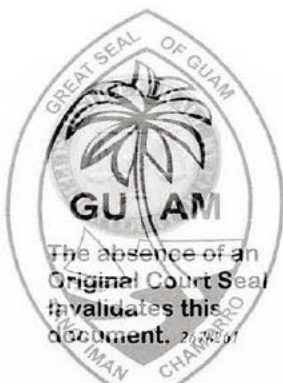

Hafa Adai Senator Taitague and Committee Members,

Un Dankolo na Si Yu'os Ma'ase for the opportunity to appear before you as an appointee of Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC).

I am today a proud government of Guam retiree, having retired this past January 30th after 16 years of service to the people of Guam. It is said that retirement is a time for new roads and passions. I consider this nomination as a continuation of my passion for the rights of victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Together with the Honorable Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson and Dr. Lisa Flores, I look forward to expanding the Commission's work and mission for victims of crime.

For the last seven years, I have served as Director of the Bureau of Women's Affairs, managing nearly a million dollars in annual federal formula grants for Guam under the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) program which includes the S.T.O.P and Sexual Assault Services Programs (SASP) servicing victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking (DVDVSAS/HT). The Bureau was also awarded \$3Million in discretionary grants for more focused DVDVSAS/HT projects with both government and nonprofit subgrantees.

I am keenly aware of the needs of victims of crime and the trauma-informed services critical to their recovery through BWA's OVW grant funding provided to community-based non-profits and government agencies. I have developed strong working relationships with Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO), Erica's House, Guma Mami, Alee Shelter, the Public Defender Service Corporation, the Civil Law Center, the Guam Police Department, the Judiciary of Guam, the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and its Healing Hearts Crisis Center, the Department of Youth Affairs, and the Office of the Attorney General, among other entities.


My work through BWA as a member of the Guam Homeless Coalition has given me insight into the struggles of individuals and families that all too often end in violence. I understand that homelessness is a complicated and multi-faceted issue, especially for women and children who are victims of domestic violence. The Silent Witness Ceremony honoring victims and survivors of violent crime is a powerful reminder that our work is never ending. My experiences working with

victim service providers has been truly rewarding. It is impossible for anyone who has engaged in this type of work to walk away simply because of retirement. On the contrary, retirement offers me an opportunity to channel my years of experience into another avenue of productivity and compassion for the people of our island. I have a strong desire to continue my services to victims of crime and community-based organizations as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.

I have studied the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission enabling statute and I am familiar with the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) federal grant that partially funds the Commission. If confirmed, I can promise the members of the 38th Guam Legislature that I will dedicate my time on the Commission to improving our island's services to victims of violent crime by affording them compensation under the parameters of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program. I know that money cannot make up for the trauma that victims have faced and will continue to deal with probably for the rest of their lives. But at least the compensation awarded by the Commission can provide victims some measure of monetary relief for medical and funeral expenses not of their making.

Again, *Si Yu'os Ma'ase* to Governor Leon Guerrero for her faith in my ability to serve on this important commission, and to yourself, Senator Taitague, and committee members, for the opportunity to appear before you. I am happy to answer any questions you may have regarding my appointment or qualifications.

(8 GCA §161.130)

The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC) submits this 2026 Annual Report representing prior Calendar Year 2025, in conjunction with the Office of the Attorney General's FY 2027 Budget Request as required by 8 GCA § 161.130.

1. **COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP.** The Commission is comprised of five (5) appointed members with advice and consent of the Guam Legislature. There are two members presently serving on the Commission: Hon. Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Chair (2023-2027), and Dr. Lisa Flores (2024-2028). The term of Commissioner Denise Mendiola expired April 1, 2025, which left two vacancies, one of which is dedicated to a youth member according to law. On July 10, 2025, the Chair notified the Governor of the vacancies and requested her earliest appointments. On January 2, 2026, Commissioner (Pale) Michael Crisostomo sadly passed away. The Commission is presently without a quorum. The Governor has forwarded a nomination to the Legislature for consideration.
2. **HISTORY.** The CICC was originally established in 1986 by P.L. 16-86 under the Guam Civil Code. The statute was amended in 1990, 1996, and 2004, but never became fully operational until 2016. In 2023, the statute was again amended to incorporate federally mandated changes for the protection of victim confidentiality (P.L. 37-40). The Commission also adopted revised Rules and Regulations on March 1, 2024, which were passed by the Guam Legislature on August 28, 2025 (P.L. 38-52) and are now published as part of the Guam Administrative Rules & Regulations (GARR). The statutory and regulatory framework of the Commission is now completed.

The Commission became fully operational for the first time in 2016, with administrative infrastructure and support provided by the Office of the Attorney General. Over the last 10 years the Commission has awarded approximately \$1.1 Million to victims of crime. The Commission looks forward to expanding community awareness of the program and build stronger relations with national organizations in the coming years.

The Guam Legislature authorized a direct appropriation to the Commission of \$65,000 in FY24 and again in FY25 for non-personnel expenses. The OAG continues to carry the burden for most of the operational needs of the Commission.

6. FUND BALANCE. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund is a NON-General Fund government account managed by the OAG with deposits registered by the Department of Administration (DOA). The primary source of revenue into the Fund comes from fines paid by defendants adjudged guilty of violent crimes within the jurisdiction of the

program. The Judiciary of Guam is statutorily required to transmit those payments to the Fund on a regular basis. The OAG and DOA closely monitor these transfers. The Commission also started receiving federal compensation funding in 2019 from the Victims of Crime Act federal grant. This grant pays .75 cents for every dollar that the Commission awards. The Commission has been awarded a total of \$380,000. Federal grant funds between 2019-2025.

The CICC Fund is a statutorily protected fund and is not subject to transfer authority of the Governor of Guam without the written authority of the Attorney General.

Balance in the CICC Fund as of December 31, 2025, is \$1,228,590.34.



Flores, was appointed by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* to serve as **Member, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC) on January 6, 2026, for a Term Length of Four (4) years; From Date of Confirmation.** The transmittal of appointment was received by the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on **January 20, 2026** and subsequently referred by the *I Liheslaturan's* Committee on Rules to the Legislative Committee on *Economic Investment, Military Buildup, Regional Relations, Technology, Regulatory Affairs, Justice, Elections, and Retirement*, on **January 20, 2026.** The Committee convened a Public Hearing on **Friday, February 06, 2026 at 2:00 p.m.,** in the Guam Congress Building, Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirement:

In Compliance with Open Government Law, a five (5) day public notice of this hearing was published on **Friday, January 30, 2026,** and a forty-eight (48) hour notice was published on **Wednesday, February 04, 2026,** on KUAM-TV and the Guam Public Notice Website. So, before I begin with this hearing, I have some rules of engagement. So when you speak, please speak directly into the microphone. And for the record, please state your name, position, and who you represent as well. I ask those who are testifying today to please stay seated for any questions afterwards. And then I respectfully ask that we conduct ourselves professionally and respect each other's opinion. That being said, the agenda for this afternoon is for the following. Appointment of Jayne T. Flores to serve as a member on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission or the CICC for a term of the length of four years from date of confirmation.

So, at this time I'd like to invite those who are here to testify on her behalf to come up forward. If you signed in, come up forward and then while you're doing that and getting settled in, I'll just make a couple comments.

The duties and the responsibilities of the Criminal Inquiries Compensation, injuries I'm sorry not inquiries. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission before we hear the appointee herself for those present the Commission is an independent body that handles claims for violent victims of violent crimes it also has the authority to adjudicate applications and make payments to victims or dependents from the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund. Upon an application made by the Commission under this chapter, the Commission shall fix a time and place for a hearing on such application and shall cause notice thereof to be given to the applicant. The Commission may hold such hearings, sit and act as such times and places, and take such testimonies as the Commission may deem advisable. Any member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Commission. The Commission shall have such powers of subpoena and compulsion of attendance of witnesses and production of documents and of examination of witnesses as are conferred upon the Superior Court.

We did submit, no. I think it was submitted already. We received the appointee's testimony earlier that we have. If anybody would like to get a copy, please let me know. We'll be happy to do it. So, at this time, I am going to yield to our former Attorney General, Judge and a great public servant to the people of Guam, Elizabeth Barrett Anderson. If you don't mind, please state your name for the record who you represent and we would like to hear your testimony.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: Good afternoon, Madam Chair. It's always a great pleasure to appear in front of you. My name is Elizabeth Barrett Anderson, retired superior court judge, currently the chair of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. And I know sometimes it's so hard to get that "I".

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: I know. I think I said something else earlier that was like inquiries. Inquiries. I'm like, no. So, I apologize for that. That was like, what was I saying? Inquiries.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: No apologies. It's a mouthful. So, it's a lot easier just to say Commission.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: As well as the responsibilities that you have. It's just so full and I appreciate your work. Please continue.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: Okay. Thank you very much, Madam Chair. I have my written testimony in front of me, but I won't be reading purely from it. I want to say that I have known Jayne Flores for over 20 years in many different capacities. Certainly, her journalism capacity and when she decided to join this administration, I became more familiar with the work that she was doing in the government for the Bureau of Women's Affairs. I find her extremely capable, intelligent, a great manager and a wealth of background because of her almost eight years now in working in government service. And as you know, Senator, when you get a candidate that has that kind of strong government background, then it brings a wealth to any of the Commissions that come before you. The Commission right now is in its 10th year, 10 years now. 2016 it became operational and this is its 10th year.

We've gone through a lot of ups and downs. I've been here with the Commission from its start and then through the last four years. Now my Commission does not expire until 2027 and I hope to stay on if the governor, whoever the governor may be in 2027 or the legislature, would like me to continue. I enjoy the work, but I have to tell you that it's been very, very, the word isn't difficult, but it's been a long trail working with you as a former senator on the committee that was formerly with Senator Therese Terlaje. We've brought down a new set of statutes in 2023. And in that statute, we protected the confidentiality of victims. And the senators, you all supported it. Thank you so much. And then just most recently, last year again, the rules and regulations. So, Senator Taitague, we now have the statutory framework really solid. We have the regulatory framework solid. It is now published in the Guam rules, Guam administrative rules and regulations so that's there. And so now every time we move 10 steps forward, Senator, we kind of get, you know, five steps back.

And I want us to all to please remember and say a prayer for Commissioner *Påle* Mike Crisostomo. It was devastating when he passed. He's been with the Commission, I think, for like 12 to 14 years. So, he certainly was there when we

became operational and his presence was very comforting. He was a tough Commissioner. He fought very hard for the rights of victims, the claims of victims. So, his passing was truly devastating. Truly devastating. The Governor has been working with me even prior to *Påle* Mike's passing because we had two vacancies at the time, and then when *Påle* Mike, well one vacancy, one nomination came down and unfortunately as you recall that had to be retracted because the nominee did not qualify, correct. She would have been great. She would have been fantastic. So, I was disappointed there. So, Jayne was I think in contemplation already and then when I wrote to you, you immediately also wrote to the Governor and this nomination came down very, very speedily.

So, I can't thank you enough for this hearing today and continuing to stand by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. I will tell you that Jayne is the right stuff. You know, I hope I hope that says it all. She's the right stuff and I think she will be a very, very strong Commissioner if the Legislature confirms her. We will still have two more vacancies. One of the vacancies has to be a youth member and then a third vacancy, I think the governor has somebody in mind but that name has not been sent down. So, it's one of those we get ten steps forward with the law and the statutes and the regulations and then we move backwards in time and but it's persistent Senator and we as women are very persistent. We wait. We are stern and if it takes time, we will take the time because this is a Commission that cannot fail. It has to continue. But thank you very much.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Very welcome. And thank you so much for taking a moment to recognize *Påle* Mike, you know, and his contribution not just to this Commission but just as an individual what kind of person he was. He just he touched so many people and we're hoping that his legacy and memory will continue to push us forward to do the right thing and to serve the people like he did for everyone. So, thank you for recognizing and thank you for your kind words on that. Okay. And the next one we have here, Karen. Yes, please. Go ahead and turn on the microphone. Just press that button right there. There you go. You're good to go. And state your name for the record who you are and then you may proceed.

KAREN CARPENTER: My name is Karen Carpenter. I'm a citizen and I'm also a volunteer with Victim Advocates Reaching Out or VARO, better known as VARO. I've been working with Jayne since she became active with the or was the director for the GCOFPO, governor's community outreach federal programs office and the Bureau of Women's Affairs and with the GCOFPO the federal office, the grants office there are subgrantees and VARO has been a subgrantee so we've worked with for many years. And the thing that I think really qualifies her for this position with the Commission is she really does understand victims. She's worked with grants that have supplied money to help serve victims. She's heard the stories in our meetings. and I think she'll bring a real compassionate view to the work that needs to be done by the Commission. But besides that, she also has worked a lot with grants.

So, she really understands the need to stay within the parameters of the funding that is there. The need to watch the expenses so that they don't go over the need to be sure that the expenses are allowable by law and by whatever rules and regulations the Commission has and I think there aren't a lot of people that have all of that kind of experience that they can bring to the Commission. And I, and the other thing, and this may seem a little silly, but she goes to meetings, but that's important because you got to have a quorum. And so, I'm impressed that, you know, when she's supposed to be at a meeting, she's usually there. And so that too, I think, is important. I know that she'll be a very strong member for the Commission. I know she'll be a very committed member and so I definitely support her.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you so much for your testimony today. And at this time, we would like to hear from the nominee herself and if you're ready. Yeah. Okay. So, if there's anybody else who would like to testify before I...Okay, that being said, at this time, Mrs. Flores, you are recognized.

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: Thank you. *Håfa Adai* Senator Taitague. My name is Jayne Flores, and I am the governor's nominee for the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. And before I begin my testimony today, I too want to honor the late *Påle* Mike Christoimo. His absence is felt throughout our island community as well as on the Commission. *Påle* Mike may not have been large in physical stature, but he was a giant among men in his capacity for love and compassion, especially toward victims of crime. If the 38th Guam legislature

chooses to confirm me as a member of the CICC, I will have giant shoes to fill. *Un dângkulu na si Yu'os ma'åse'* for the opportunity to appear before you as an appointee of Governor Lourdes Leon Guerrero to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.

I am today a proud Government of Guam retiree, having retired this past January 30th after 16 years of service to the people of Guam. It is said that retirement is a time for new roads and passions. I consider this nomination as a continuation of my passion for the rights of victims of domestic violence and sexual assault as well as other crimes. Together with the Honorable Judge Liz Barrett Anderson and Dr. Lisa Flores, I look forward to expanding the Commission's work and mission for victims of crime.

For the last seven years, I have served as director of the Bureau of Women's Affairs, managing nearly a million dollars in annual federal formula grants for Guam under the Violence Against Women Act program, which includes our STOP and sexual assault services programs, servicing victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking. The bureau has also been awarded \$3 Million in discretionary grants for more focused DVDVSAS/HT projects with both government and nonprofit subgrantees.

I'm keenly aware of the needs of victims of crime and the trauma informed services critical to their recovery through BWA's OVW grant funding provided to community-based nonprofit and government agencies. I've developed strong working relationships with victim advocates reaching out Vero Erica's House, Guma Mami, Ali Shelter, the Public Defender Service Corporation, the Civil Law Center, the Guam Police Department, the Judiciary of Guam, the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and its Healing Hearts Crisis Center, the Department of Youth Affairs, and the Office of the Attorney General, among other entities.

My work through BWA as a member of the Guam Homeless Coalition has given me insight into the struggles of individuals and families that all too well end in violence. I understand that homelessness is a complicated and multifaceted issue, especially for women and children who are victims of domestic violence. The

silent witness ceremony honoring victims and survivors of violent crime each year is a powerful reminder that our work is never ending. My experiences working with victim service providers has been truly rewarding. It is impossible for anyone who is engaged in this type of work to walk away simply because of retirement. On the contrary, retirement offers me an opportunity to channel my years of experience into another avenue of productivity and compassion for the people of our island.

I have a strong desire to continue my services to victims of crime and community-based organizations as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. I've studied the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission enabling statute and I am very familiar with the Victims of Crime Act federal grant that partially funds the Commission. If confirmed, I can promise the members of the 38th Guam Legislature and yourself, Senator, that I will dedicate my time on the Commission to improving our island services to victims of violent crime by affording them compensation under the parameters of this Criminal Injuries Compensation Program. I know that money cannot make up for that victims have faced and will continue to deal with probably for the rest of their lives. But at least the compensation awarded by the Commission can provide victims some measure of monetary relief for medical and funeral expenses not of their making.

Again, *si Yu'os ma'ase'* to Governor Leon Guerrero for her faith in my ability to serve on this important Commission and to yourself, Senator Taitague and committee members for the opportunity to appear before you. I'm happy to answer any questions you may have regarding my appointment or qualifications.

SENATOR TELO TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you so much for your testimony. I would open it up to the tables and chairs here to ask any questions right now, but please, I don't want you to be disheartened that nobody's here because sometimes that means that people have confidence in your ability and there really is no questions. You know, they know your work already. So, please don't make it reflect because nobody's here on that. And a lot of times if I feel comfortable too with an individual, you know, I'm either here to say thank you, you know, so much for coming to serve, we definitely know your background. These last few years, we've run into each other and talked about the women's bureau at the very beginning when you first came in as I was a director of women's bureau before. And in fact, that brings me to a question of are you still going to be the women's bureau director?

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: No, I retired. So, the new director I believe the governor is appointing Sarah Elmore Hernandez. So, she has been, I believe she's been appointed.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Okay. Has she already taken over the position as acting right now or have you stepped down already?

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: I have stepped down.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Okay because your application says present. Oh. So, I'll be ensuring ...

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: It was present when I filled it out.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Yeah. Okay. Well, I'll be sure to let my colleagues know that it's not, you know an amendment will be made to your application that it's not present. So, you know, technically that was the only question I have. I mean, we both know that your experience at the Women's Bureau and especially working with the federal outreach program that you incorporated into the Women's Bureau, which I always wanted to be able to do and I'm glad to see it was done. That you have firsthand on what is really needed in order to get grants and move forward with any, thank you. Move forward with any grants and the ability to be able to find more grants, you know. So, that's a big thing and I'm pretty sure the Commission is very happy to do that because I know you're a stickler when it is to looking for funding and this a Commission could sure use you know some help in that arena. In fact, what part do you think that you can bring to this Commission that would actually, you know, I mean, we know *Påle Mike's shoes* is hard to fill, but you have your own talents yourself and your own experiences. What can you bring to this Commission to assist them?

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: Well, I think research number one on grants that we may be able to help with the Commission's mission to fund expenses for

victims of crime. The Commission is the VOCA grant is a reimbursement grant and which means that victims have to find someone to front the money or front the money themselves before they get reimbursed for the grant. Correct?

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: That's correct. And what I would like to see the Commission or with someone as strong as Jayne is, the Commission has the ability to seek non-governmental donations. And so, in Jayne's perspective, for example, if a victim has her window or door bashed in because someone broke in, the Commission can only reimburse on an incurred expense. But if we could use donated money that doesn't have a lot of the federal entanglement, then we might be able to say, "Okay, here this is money upfront." Or if a victim can get someone to fix it, then we can reimburse. So, there's whenever and Senator, you know this, whenever we take federal money, there's a lot of restrictions to it. So, I do want to make mention that I have sent to your committee and I just dropped it off to the Speaker's. I know it's a bit early, but the Commission is required to give the legislature its annual report. So, I did send the 2026 CICC report to the legislature in anticipation of the attorney general's fiscal year 2027 budget hearings. And if the hearings go on, if I could be invited because sometimes the senators have questions on the CICC that some of the Attorney General's staff members are not able to answer. I do want to let you know that we have three brand new staff people that the Attorney General's office gave to the Commission just recently.

So, on the one hand, we are trying to bring these three new staff people up to par on this federal program and at the same time trying to fill the vacancies in the Commission. So, anything that the legislature can do to promptly have her confirmed I'd love to have Jayne help me train the new staff and so that we can really do outreach. This last year I visited Guam Regional Medical Center and met with their management and said victims come to your emergency room and they should we should have pamphlets there and your social workers who take care of injured victims should be able to know to reach out to the attorney general's office advocates to VARO advocates and to apply to the Commission for injuries.

There's one thing that I know that the Commission needs to do. People need to know more about us. I mean, there's no doubt about that, you know, Senator. And with a full staff and a full Commission, I really think that the day where we can actually get out and do more outreach will be to the benefit of the people of Guam. So, we're so close to that.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Okay. And how much funding will you need to reach that goal? You know, just have more of a presence out in the community for people to know what they can avail themselves with if they come in that situation. How much money do you spend on that yearly?

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: With the three staff that the attorney general. These are OAG personnel. They're not CICC personnel. Their budget is about \$262,000 just for those three personnel. And we've never had three before. We've only had one. And there's been such a rotation. The perfect criminal injuries compensation administrative unit would look like this. A Commission, an Executive Director, someone who is either unclassified or classified. And it's that the Executive Director is stable when Commissioners come and go, but we have a stable executive director. So, you're asking me a dollar figure, and I know you're good at that. So, I would say at least \$350,000 to the Attorney General's budget directly for the CICC. So, we have some stability there.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Okay. Yep. And that would be, you know, housing one permanent position for sure to like you said, that historical knowledge, the information moving forward on your initiatives from the board is very helpful. I mean, you have the same thing with the charter schools, you know, and you have that one person that always be there to ensure that the whatever they need to move forward is done and that institutional knowledge is so helpful, you know. So having somebody there permanently is so helpful.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: I'm the institutional knowledge right. So, I'm training ...

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: You're not going to retire soon, are you? Let's hope not.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: So, I'm training the staff and actually the staff we have right now a management analyst, a legal secretary, and a legal clerk. And those are powerful positions. They're very

good employees. And if we could have a more stable budget so that with the change in the elected offices of the attorney general. That staff doesn't rotate with it because when that staff rotates it's the victims who's waiting who are waiting for their applications that end up suffering so.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Yeah, losing out. That's okay. Well, I'll definitely take that under advisement as well as I'll reach out to the attorney general and see what we can do on that perspective. And you're right, budget time's coming up, so it's a perfect time to ask. So, I'm glad you did, you know, so bring that in. But other than that, I like that one part that you put down in your testimony that you went back and researched, you know, some of the, what did you say at the end? I've studied the Criminal and Injuries compensation Commission enabling statute. That's a first start. Is there a website that you put up?

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: Oh, that's another thing we should do. Part of that budget. Yeah, we can actually if you go to the office of the attorney general website, you're able to find the CICC and there are forms there that need to be updated because they're a little bit old but it would be nice to have a better website within the OAG for the criminal injuries Commission.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Specifically, for that.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: Exactly. And I'll tell you, the other day I was searching nationwide and I saw these fantastic videos about what is a Commission and what you can do. So not just going online but what do you call that? those types of videos where ...

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: Informational videos.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Informational tutorials.

ELIZABETH BARRETT-ANDERSON, CHAIRPERSON, CICC: Informational videos if we could, if Jayne comes on board and we can find some federal money for informational videos. I don't know how much those cost but informational videos are the best way to get out there. The thing is when we do that victims become more aware of the Commission, more applications come in. So, we

really need to keep these three employees there as long as we possibly can because their workload will increase.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Yeah. And I think this video website would also allow for links for places like VARO and other you know nonprofit organizations that can assist the victims. So, this website will have a link to all those areas too. So, it'll become a one-stop you know area that is just dedicated for that. And I think the attorney general does a very good job and posting everything on his website. I think he would be very amendable to start that up right away, you know, and get one of them. So, I'll reach out to him as well. And the last thing I have to offer here is my door. It is always open to anybody who's willing to sacrifice their time away from family to sacrifice anything, you know moving forward of your free time with travel.

You know most people want to take off and travel and enjoy themselves but you've decided to stay on to serve the people of Guam. And that says a lot about an individual. So, if you can do that, then my door is always open. If you have any questions that I can assist you with or any help that you may need and you definitely know where I work. I mean our office is, you know, because we were sharing the same building. So, the fourth floor so if you get.

JAYNE FLORES, APPOINTEE: Senator, I am honored to have been asked to serve on the Commission.

SENATOR TELO T. TAITAGUE, CHAIRPERSON: Okay. Anything else you would like to add or before I close it out? Okay, we're all good. I see your husband's here to support you. That's a good sign. Keep her busy, right? And it lessened you to honeydew list, right? If you keep her busy. Okay. So, that being said, let me end this by if there are no other further questions.

This concludes our discussion and testimony for the appointee of Jane Flores to serve on the Commission. And if anyone wants to send any written testimonies, we're going to be doing this for 5 days. III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that the testimony presented at the Public Hearing strongly supports the confirmation of Ms. Jayne T. Flores to serve as a Member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC).

The Committee received written and oral testimony from the appointee, the Chairperson of the Commission, and community stakeholders engaged in victim advocacy. Ms. Flores, in her testimony, expressed a clear commitment to continuing her longstanding work in support of victims of crime. She highlighted her sixteen (16) years of Government of Guam service, including seven (7) years as Director of the Bureau of Women's Affairs, where she managed nearly \$1 million annually in federal Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) formula grants and secured approximately \$3 million in discretionary grant funding. She further demonstrated familiarity with the Commission's enabling statute and the federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding framework, emphasizing her intent to improve services and outreach for victims of violent crime.

Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Chairperson of the CICC, testified that Mrs. Flores possesses over two decades of experience dedicated to victim advocacy and described her as capable, intelligent, and well-versed in government operations and grant administration. The Chairperson emphasized the urgent need to restore quorum following the passing of Commissioner *Påle* Mike Crisostomo and stated that confirmation of Mrs. Flores is crucial to the continued functioning and growth of the Commission.

Additional written testimony from Samuel Ilesugam, Executive Director of Guma' Mami, Inc., described Mrs. Flores as compassionate, fair-minded, and deeply committed to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, noting her integrity and leadership during her tenure at the Bureau of Women's Affairs.

The Committee further notes that the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission plays a vital role in adjudicating claims and providing financial relief to victims of violent crime, and that restoring quorum is necessary to ensure uninterrupted service to the community.

Based on the testimony presented, the Committee finds that Ms. Jayne T. Flores possesses the professional experience, administrative background, subject matter expertise, and demonstrated commitment to victim advocacy necessary to effectively serve on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.

In addition to providing testimony on the appointment, Chairperson Barrett-Anderson also submitted a copy of the CICC's 2026 Annual Report to the Committee. The 2026 Annual Report of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC), submitted pursuant to 8 GCA § 161.130, reports that the Commission is currently operating without a quorum, with only two active members following vacancies and the passing of Commissioner Pale' Michael Crisostomo.

In Calendar Year 2025, the Commission received 14 applications from victims of violent crimes and approved awards totaling \$52,279.43. Several applications were denied due to statutory limitations or lack of required documentation. Per the report, since becoming fully operational in 2016, the Commission has awarded approximately \$1.1 million to victims of crime. As of December 31, 2025, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund balance stands at \$1,228,590.34, supported primarily by court-ordered fines and supplemented by federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds. The report emphasizes that the statutory and regulatory framework of the Commission is now complete, but restoring membership and quorum is critical to ensuring continued service to victims of violent crime

The Committee on Economic Investment, Military Buildup, Regional Relations, Technology, Regulatory Affairs, Justice, Elections, and Retirement hereby reports out the *Executive Appointment of Jayne T. Flores, to serve as Member, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, for a Term Length of Four (4) Years; From Date of Confirmation*, with the recommendation To do Confirm.
