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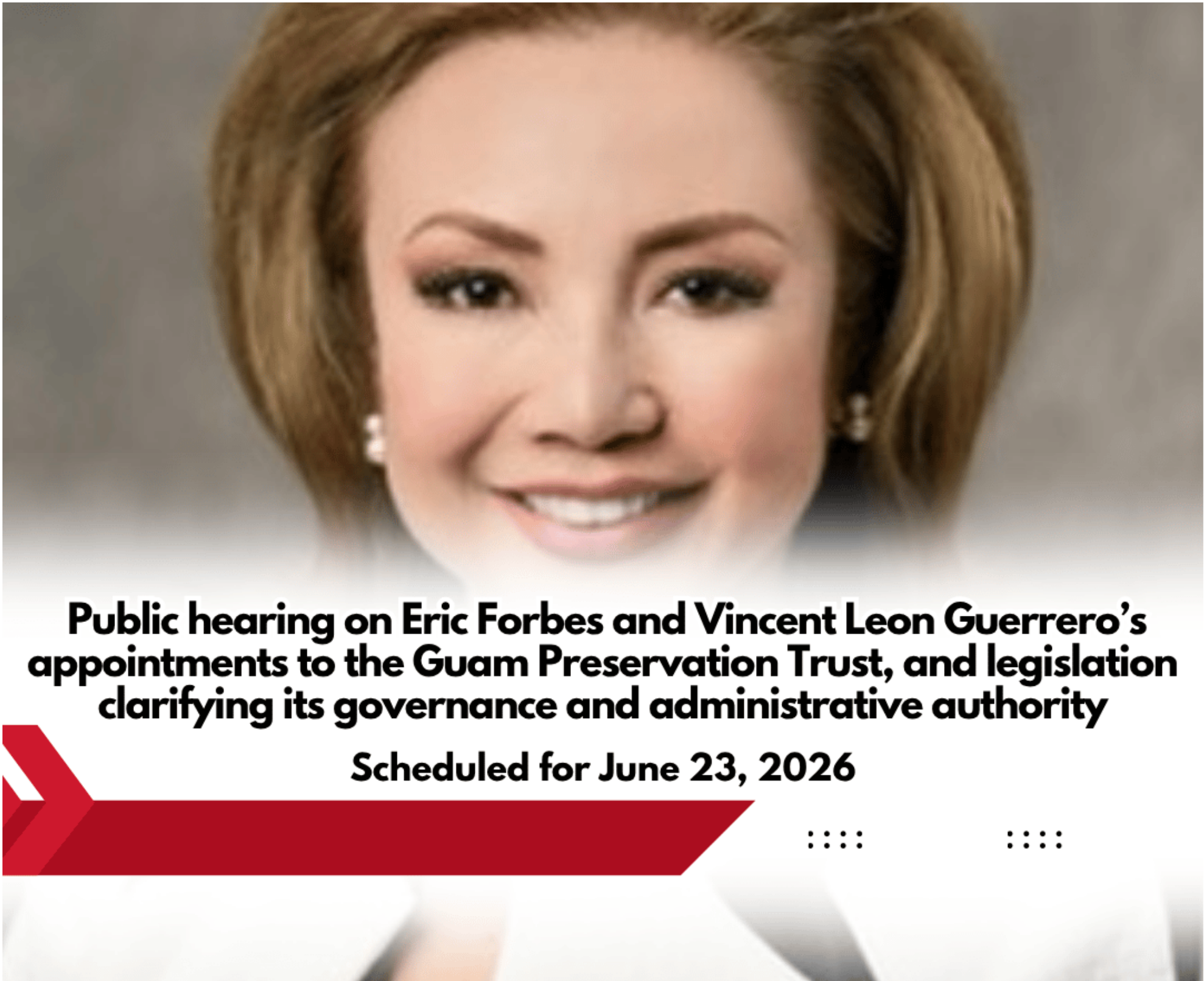

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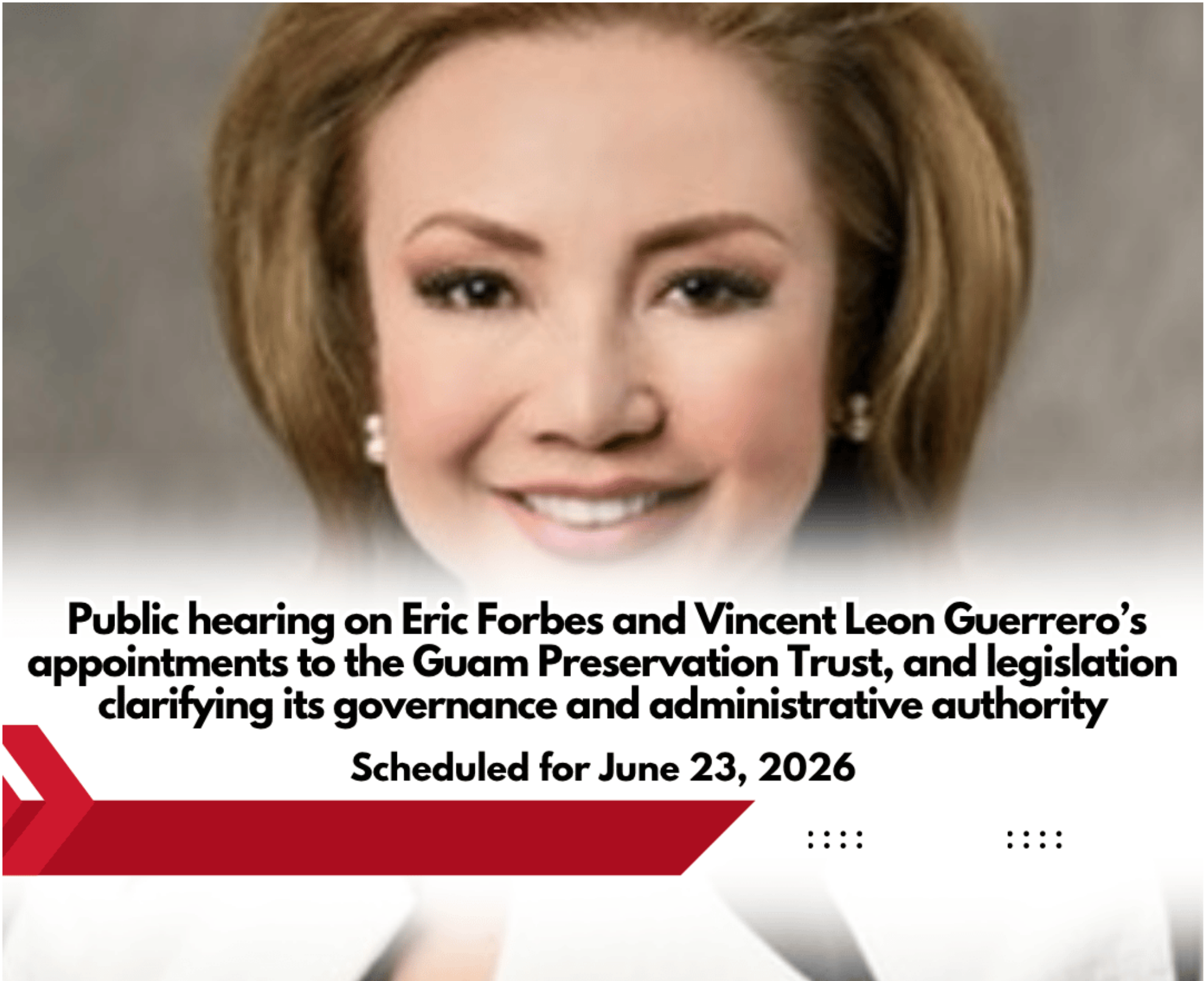

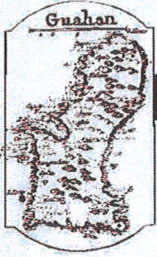

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I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Child Welfare, Youth Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women's Affairs, Disability Services, the Arts, Culture, Historic Preservation, and Hagåtña Restoration convened a public hearing on June 23, 2026, to consider the appointments of Pale' Eric Forbes and Vincent A.R. Leon Guerrero to serve on the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board (GHPRB).

While the hearing focused on the qualifications of the nominees, the discussion expanded into a broader examination of historic preservation in Guam and the responsibilities of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board as stewards of the island's cultural, historical, archaeological, and ancestral resources.

Throughout the hearing, senators, stakeholders, and preservation advocates emphasized that historic preservation is more than an administrative function of government—it is a responsibility owed to past, present, and future generations of Guam. Committee members noted that Guam's heritage extends beyond historic structures and archaeological sites to include ancestral landscapes, oral traditions, language, cultural practices, sacred places, burial grounds, and the collective memory of the island's people.

Testimony reflected shared concerns regarding increasing pressures on Guam's historic resources, including development, military expansion, infrastructure projects, and changing land-use priorities. At the same time, participants stressed the importance of maintaining preservation as an active component of public policy and community development.

The hearing also provided an opportunity to examine the effectiveness of existing preservation governance structures, particularly the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and its relationship with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), the Guam Preservation Trust (GPT), and federal preservation programs under the National Historic Preservation Act.

The Committee found that the appointments carried significance beyond the confirmation of two individuals. The hearing served as an opportunity to evaluate how Guam intends to preserve its cultural identity, protect its ancestral resources, and ensure meaningful public participation in decisions affecting the island's historical legacy.

Testimony demonstrated strong support for both nominees and confidence in their ability to contribute to Guam's preservation efforts. However, the hearing also highlighted concerns regarding the prolonged inactivity of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and the need to strengthen preservation oversight, transparency, and community engagement moving forward.

APPOINTEES CONSIDERED

Pale' Eric Forbes

Pale' Eric Forbes has served on the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and the Guam Preservation Trust Board for many years and is widely recognized as a historian, researcher, educator, author, preservation advocate, and community leader. His work has focused on documenting Guam's history, preserving historic sites, promoting cultural awareness, and supporting preservation initiatives throughout the island.

Vincent A.R. Leon Guerrero

Vincent A.R. Leon Guerrero is a longtime educator and Guam History teacher who has dedicated much of his professional career to promoting historical awareness among

Guam's youth. His work includes participation in Guam History Day, National History Day, educational outreach initiatives, and preservation programs designed to connect younger generations to Guam's cultural and historical heritage.

II. TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT

A. Joe Quinata

Former Guam Preservation Trust Chief Program Officer Joe Quinata testified in support of both nominees.

Mr. Quinata emphasized the extensive preservation experience, historical knowledge, and community service demonstrated by both nominees throughout their years of service. He noted that both individuals have played significant roles in advancing preservation efforts throughout Guam and have consistently advocated for the protection of cultural and historic resources.

Mr. Quinata highlighted their contributions to educational programs, community outreach initiatives, preservation planning, and cultural resource management.

B. Andrew Tenorio

Andrew Tenorio, Interim Chief Program Officer of the Guam Preservation Trust, testified in support of both nominees.

Mr. Tenorio described Pale' Eric Forbes as a respected historian and preservation advocate whose knowledge and leadership have strengthened numerous preservation initiatives throughout Guam.

Mr. Tenorio also emphasized Vincent Leon Guerrero's dedication to education and youth engagement, noting that his efforts have helped connect students to Guam's history and cultural identity through classroom instruction and extracurricular programs.

Mr. Tenorio stated that both nominees continue to be valuable assets to the preservation community and remain highly qualified to serve on the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board.

III. NOMINEE TESTIMONY

A. Testimony of Pale' Eric Forbes

Mr. Forbes discussed his longstanding service on the Guam Preservation Trust Board and the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board.

He described several preservation projects currently being undertaken or supported by the Guam Preservation Trust, including:

- Inalåhan Baptist Church restoration efforts;
- George Flores House restoration initiatives;
- Historic preservation planning involving the former F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School property;
- Preservation activities involving Atantano and other significant cultural sites;
- Preservation studies and inventories of cultural resources and rare plants.

Mr. Forbes emphasized that preservation remains an essential responsibility as Guam continues to experience growth and development.

He stated that the original mission of the Guam Preservation Trust remains highly relevant today and that preservation must remain a central consideration in community development.

Mr. Forbes also expressed concern regarding the inactivity of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and acknowledged that the Board has not met for several years despite repeated requests from members.

He indicated that clarification of Board procedures and governance may be necessary to ensure that statutory duties are fulfilled.

B. Testimony of Vincent A.R. Leon Guerrero

Mr. Leon Guerrero emphasized the importance of preservation through education.

Drawing upon nearly two decades of teaching Guam History, he explained that preservation is not limited to structures and archaeological resources but also includes preserving traditions, stories, language, identity, and historical understanding.

Mr. Leon Guerrero described several educational programs supported by the Guam Preservation Trust, including:

- Guam History Day;
- National History Day;
- Historic site tours;
- Cultural education programs;
- Student preservation projects.

He stated that educational outreach remains one of the most effective ways to ensure that future generations understand Guam's history and develop a commitment to preservation.

Mr. Leon Guerrero emphasized that Guam's history should be shared not only locally but nationally, ensuring that Guam's unique contributions to American history and culture are properly recognized.

IV. COMMITTEE DISCUSSION

A. Historic Preservation as a Public Trust

Throughout the hearing, senators repeatedly emphasized that historic preservation must be viewed as a public trust rather than merely a regulatory responsibility.

Committee members discussed how preservation decisions affect not only physical structures and archaeological resources, but also the identity, history, and cultural continuity of the people of Guam.

Several senators observed that preservation efforts must balance economic growth and development with the obligation to protect irreplaceable cultural resources.

Discussion highlighted the importance of ensuring that future generations inherit not only physical landmarks, but also the stories, traditions, knowledge, and cultural values associated with those places.

The Committee noted that preservation serves as a bridge between generations and provides communities with a tangible connection to their collective history.

B. Governance and Function of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board

A substantial portion of the hearing focused on the statutory responsibilities and operational status of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board.

Committee members reviewed the Board's legal responsibilities under Guam law, including its role in evaluating historic property nominations, reviewing preservation plans, advising on preservation policies, and carrying out responsibilities associated with the National Historic Preservation Act.

The discussion revealed significant concern that the Board had not convened for an extended period despite these responsibilities.

Several senators questioned how the Board could effectively fulfill its statutory mandate without regular meetings and active engagement.

Committee members emphasized that preservation oversight requires more than nominal appointments and that Board members must have meaningful opportunities to exercise their authority and fulfill their responsibilities.

The Committee observed that prolonged inactivity risks limiting public participation, reducing transparency, and weakening independent oversight of preservation matters affecting Guam's cultural resources.

C. Programmatic Agreement and Cultural Resource Protection

One of the most significant policy discussions centered on the proposed Programmatic Agreement currently under consideration.

Committee members expressed concern regarding the long-term implications of the agreement and its potential impact on future consultation requirements, preservation reviews, archaeological investigations, and public participation processes.

Particular concern was expressed regarding the treatment of ancestral remains, cultural landscapes, archaeological sites, and historic properties affected by large-scale development and military construction activities.

Committee members stressed that preservation decisions should not be viewed solely through the lens of regulatory compliance, but should also reflect Guam's cultural values and obligations to future generations.

Several senators emphasized that preservation efforts must account for broader cultural landscapes rather than isolated sites, recognizing that cultural significance often extends beyond individual artifacts or structures.

The Committee observed that decisions made today regarding preservation policy may establish precedents that influence preservation practices for decades to come.

D. Transparency and Community Engagement

A recurring theme throughout the hearing was the importance of transparency and meaningful public participation.

Committee members noted that preservation efforts are strongest when communities have access to information and opportunities to participate in decision-making processes.

Discussion focused on the need for greater public access to preservation studies, archaeological findings, historical research, and information generated through development reviews.

Several senators emphasized that informed communities are better equipped to advocate for preservation and contribute constructively to policy discussions.

The Committee observed that transparency strengthens public trust and promotes accountability among preservation institutions.

E. Preservation Through Education

The Committee devoted considerable attention to the role of education in preserving Guam's history and cultural identity.

Witnesses described educational initiatives that introduce students to Guam's historic sites, cultural resources, and historical experiences.

Committee members recognized that preservation is ultimately dependent upon future generations understanding and valuing Guam's history.

Programs such as Guam History Day and National History Day were highlighted as effective tools for fostering historical awareness and encouraging civic engagement among students.

The Committee noted that education serves as one of the most sustainable and impactful forms of preservation because it ensures that cultural knowledge continues to be transmitted from one generation to the next.

V. KEY FINDINGS

Based on testimony received and discussion held during the hearing, the Committee identified the following findings:

1. Strong Support for Both Nominees

The Committee received strong testimony supporting both nominees. Witnesses consistently described them as qualified, knowledgeable, and dedicated preservation advocates.

2. Preservation Expertise

Both nominees demonstrated extensive knowledge of Guam's history, preservation challenges, cultural resources, and educational initiatives.

3. Review Board Inactivity

The Committee found significant concern regarding the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board's lack of meetings and inability to fully carry out its statutory responsibilities.

4. Need for Greater Public Participation

The hearing highlighted the importance of increasing public engagement and transparency in preservation decision-making processes.

5. Preservation Education Remains Critical

Educational initiatives remain one of the strongest tools available for ensuring the long-term preservation of Guam's history and cultural heritage.

6. Programmatic Agreement Requires Continued Review

Committee members identified concerns regarding the proposed Programmatic Agreement and emphasized the need for continued oversight and community participation.

7. Cultural Resource Protection Remains a Priority

The protection of historic sites, cultural landscapes, archaeological resources, and ancestral remains remains a significant public policy priority.

8. Legislative Review May Be Necessary

Discussion suggested that legislative review of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board's governing statutes may be necessary to improve accountability, governance, and operational effectiveness.

VI. COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Committee observes that Guam stands at a critical moment in its history.

As development pressures increase and major infrastructure and military projects continue to reshape the island, the responsibility to preserve Guam's cultural and historical resources becomes even more important.

The Committee further observes that preservation is not an obstacle to progress. Rather, preservation and progress must work together to ensure that economic growth does not come at the expense of cultural identity and historical memory.

The Committee recognizes that historic preservation requires vigilance, collaboration, and leadership. It requires individuals who are willing to advocate for resources that cannot be replaced once lost.

The hearing demonstrated that preservation is ultimately about people – those who came before us, those who live here today, and those who will inherit Guam in the future.

The Committee therefore views the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board as an essential institution in safeguarding the island's cultural heritage and ensuring that future generations remain connected to their history.

VII. CONCLUSION

The Committee finds that Pale' Eric Forbes and Vincent A.R. Leon Guerrero possess the qualifications, experience, expertise, integrity, and commitment necessary to continue serving on the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board.

Their testimony demonstrated a deep understanding of Guam's historical and cultural resources, while witness testimony reflected widespread confidence in their leadership and service.

The hearing also served as a reminder that preservation is more than the protection of historic sites and artifacts. Preservation is the protection of identity. It is the preservation of memory, culture, language, tradition, and community.

As Guam continues to evolve, the challenge before policymakers and preservation professionals will be ensuring that progress does not come at the cost of heritage.

The Committee believes that preserving Guam's history is not simply an act of remembering the past. It is an investment in the future. It is a commitment to ensuring that future generations inherit a Guam that remains connected to its ancestors, its culture, and its unique place in the world.
