II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing for the appointment of Mr. Mark B.C. Mendiola was called to order at 6:43PM.

COMMITTEE NOTE: Individuals who testified during the appointment hearing for Mr. Ho S. Eun also offered comments on the appointment of Mr. Mark B.C. Mendiola. Accordingly, those statements have been placed in this digest.

The Chairman of the Committee permitted individuals to provide testimony on both appointees concurrently, given that the nominations pertain to the same board.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: We're back from recess. We'll now proceed with the hearing testimony again for the appointments of: Mr. Mark B.C. Mendiola and Ms. Conchita S. N. Taitano to the members of the Port Authority Board of Directors. Colleagues may I remind you that we have a five (5) minute rule, of course, the questions, the appointees, the panel before us, but before we proceed with questions from my colleagues, I want to take a moment to acknowledge the importance of today's hearing. The appointment of the board member of the Port Authority of Guam is a matter of great significance as these individuals play a key role in setting the policies and direction of the agency. It is because of this responsibility that we must ensure appointees are prepared to address the challenges facing the Port Authority, including those that have recently come to the public attention. While I recognize that an ongoing investigation limits what can be discussed, it is my duty to ask how these nominees and the leadership of the Port Authority plan to uphold the highest standards of governance,



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accountability, and workplace integrity. It is important to address a matter that is undoubtedly in the minds of many of my colleagues, including myself. As Oversight Chairman of the Port Authority, I have the responsibility of the people of Guam to ensure transparency and accountability, especially in light of the recent developments. With that, we have a few questions. Of course, we'll have questions from the senators here, but we'll go ahead and start off again with Ms. Dorothy Harris. Go ahead, identify yourself. I'd like to acknowledge also that Mr. Mediola's family, wife and kids have been here since before 2:00PM this afternoon. Thank you for that. And we apologize that it has taken this long, but thank you very much. What commitment. What a great dad! Great kids and family. Thank you very much for that. Ms. Harris, go ahead, please.

DOROTHY P. HARRIS, CHAIRPERSON, PAG BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

Thank you. Good evening, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. I am Dorothy Perez Harris. I currently serve as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors for the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port. I am going to submit testimony in support of both nominees at this time.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you, Ms. Harris. Senator (*former* - Mr. Respicio)?

RORY J. RESPICIO, GENERAL MANAGER, PAG: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Following the lead of our Chairperson, I also have written testimony that I'd like to quickly enter into the record for our Vice Chair, Conchita Taitano, Chairperson, Jesse Lujan, and members of the Committee.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: Is that it?

RORY J. RESPICIO, GENERAL MANAGER, PAG: That concludes my testimony.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: I thought you were going to read something else.

RORY J. RESPICIO, GENERAL MANAGER, PAG: No.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you. Go ahead.

COMMITTEE NOTE: Ms. Taitano addressed the Committee regarding her appointment. Her statements have been included in its respective digest.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you, Ms. Taitano. Mr. Mendiola.

MR. MARK B.C. MENDIOLA, APPOINTEE, PAG BOARD OF DIRECTORS: Buenas noches! Good evening. For the record, my name is Mark Benny Cruz Mendiola. I'm a Guam boy. This is home. I'm glad that my family is here to join me, my wife and my boys, because a lot of the decisions I make regarding my service to the community are really rooted in the way I raise my family. So there are some questions posed. Like, Mark, why would you want to be on a board and a commission in the government? You know, I've done this for quite some time as an appointed member to the Guam Education Board, but also as an elected member. So I wore both hats, being an appointed member and then also



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answering to a constituency base. But I have to go back to 1993, when I was a student in high school. I got invited to shadow during that DYA training. Guess where I ended up? At the Port Authority of Guam. I believe Mr. Pete Leon Guerrero was the director at the time or the general manager. I got to hear terms like stevedore, yard, gantry cranes, all these different things. It made an impression on me. That's the time I actually knew that 90%, more than 90% of the stuff that's on this island, these bottles, these chairs, these microphones have entered through the Port Authority. So it's a lifeline for our island community. In terms of my service, I've always gone in with the idea that I can provide something and this is the way I was raised. My grandfather, my parents, instilled in me that if you have a set of skills and you're able to contribute to something, then go in there and Ayuda, help, you know, and so I know that there's been a lot of reports about challenges. I'm not a stranger. I don't shy away from challenges. I look at it as an opportunity to grow. Because when we as a community come together and we focus on the issue at hand, I believe that we can run an efficient government, and make the people's lives better. I serve both on the Democratic side and the Republican side. But my true loyalty lies with the People of Guam. When I address any controversial issues, I want to ensure that I have the facts before me and I understand it. Then I also like to look forward to the future. So in terms of strategic planning, understanding it, I had an opportunity to read through the Master Plan. It's a 400 page document. I'm a quick study. I like to read, I like to understand it, and then gather information. And, you know, oftentimes they say, and it's a question that was posed to me in my first confirmation hearing, you know, are you going to be a yes man? When it's an appropriate time to say yes? Absolutely. When it's the appropriate time to say no? Absolutely. I got to be able to vote my conscience and I got to be able to think about the impact of my decisions. Frankly, Senators, when I make tough decisions and if I make the wrong decisions, I imagine the disappointment in my family's face if I make the wrong decision. My boys, I'm trying to raise them in a community that's gonna be able to embrace our culture and our values. And so I want to leave a legacy back for my family and the people of Guam, that when I leave this world, that I left it a better place, and that



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the things that I've contributed to is building a stronger foundation for our island. When the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor asked me to serve, it took them a while for me to make a commitment, understanding that the complexities of these things. I've been in government for quite some time in the private sector, but I've always maintained this relationship with people, that if you're genuinely honest and you have no malice and ill intent in your heart, and you're forthright with people, then you will get things done. And I learned a lot from good mentors, Governors, Governor Calvo, Governor Ada, Dr. Underwood, you know, the President of the University. I surround myself with people, and some of you senators, I've also asked for support in certain things that I feel is important for our community. I'm just grateful for the opportunity to serve my island. That's all I want to do. I don't want to play the political game. I want to be able to serve the People of Guam and make the decisions based on what's before me. I just want to acknowledge also my family. I had a lot of people that came here to represent: my cousin Roland, Karina, my nieces and nephews, my brothers and sisters are off island. But I just want to let you know the people that stand behind me, my family, that's where my roots are. I'm a Mendiola Cruz, and so I carry those names proudly because we're from here. And everything that I do moving forward, obviously is going to have an impact on what I bring to the table. I want to reassure you a vote of confidence in my ability to go into an organization, look at the strengths, the weaknesses, the opportunities and the threats. Rest assured that I may be knocking on your door saying, hey, we need this type of support, but at the same time too, and General Manager, Rory mentioned, you know, by all means, open the hood, look underneath the hood and see what's going on with the organization. He welcomes it. I understand my role as a board member as well. I am one member of the board. We collectively act as a unit. We should not be involved in the day to day operations, but rather on the long strategic planning of the organization, the governance structure, understanding the budget, utilizing the resources that's held in trust. It's our fiduciary duties to ensure that the people's trust is maintained and we maintain the highest level of integrity. So thank you Chairman Jesse for encouraging me. I know



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some people said, hey, maybe you want to reconsider, but I'm not one to shy away from opportunities to really help out our community. Si Yu'us Ma'åse!

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: Thank you very much, Mr. Mendiola. I've been hounding you actually for – I don't know how many months now to actually accept that position. But let me ask before, before we start, does this leave the... Should Conchita be one more?

RORY J. RESPICIO, GENERAL MANAGER, PAG: One more Mr. Chair.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON: One more position. Right? And then you'll be fully boarded by then. (*Mr. Respicio nods*) Okay, thank you very much. So, colleagues, because we're combining the two (2), we're going to have ten (10) minutes instead of five (5). Okay. We're in agreement with that? (*Senators present agree*) Okay, thank you very much.

SENATOR JESSE A. LUJAN, CHAIRPERSON, BILL SPONSOR: Thank you very much. I think that's going to do it for this evening and of course thank you very much again. We're, we're all public servants here doing the people's work. This concludes today's public hearing on Bill of course 74 and the appointments of Mr. Ho, Mr. Mendiola and Ms. Taitano. The committee will continue to accept written testimony on these bills and also on the conformations within seven (7) days from today which may be addressed to myself, Senator Jesse A. III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS:



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The Committee *finds* that Mark Mendiola brings a wealth of professional experience and a strong background in public service, making him a well-qualified candidate for the Port Authority of Guam (PAG) Board of Directors. His long-standing commitment to community service, integrity, and leadership has been demonstrated through his involvement in various public sector initiatives, including his roles at the University of Guam, Guam Economic Development Authority, and the Guam Board of Education. His ability to adapt, learn quickly, and work collaboratively with diverse teams aligns well with the needs of the PAG as it continues its efforts in modernization, resilience, and strategic partnerships.

The Committee *concludes* that Mr. Mendiola's qualifications make him a valuable asset to the PAG Board of Directors. His experience and commitment to public service, paired with his focus on transparency and collaboration, will contribute positively to the Port's mission of strengthening Guam's infrastructure and economy. Additionally, his dedication to the values of public service and his role as a mentor to others within the community further solidify his readiness for this role.

The Committee *therefore* reports the confirmation hearing of Mr. Mark B.C. Mendiola as heard with the recommendation **TO DO CONFIRM.**
