Questions received from TeleGuam Holdings, LLC on 07/17/26

Question 1:

- 1) Please confirm whether services are required to be delivered via a fully underground and protected network to ensure service continuity during storms or typhoons. **Response 07/17/26: No. The RFP does not specifically require services to be delivered through a fully underground or otherwise physically protected network. The requirement is for a secure, reliable, and resilient solution that supports continuity of operations, including monitoring, outage alerting, and failover options where available. Offerors may propose the network architecture or service-delivery method they believe best satisfies these requirements.**

If an Offeror's proposed solution requires a new replacement, or additional external network connection because of compatibility limitations, resiliency requirements, or other technical considerations, the Offeror shall clearly disclose this requirement, together with all related assumptions, dependencies, third-party coordination needs, and implementation impacts. Such information will be considered during the evaluation of the proposed solution.

Question 2:

- 2) Kindly advise if vendors can provide an alternate solution such as – Hub and spoke services. **Response 07/17/26: Offerors are responsible for proposing the solution and network architecture they determine to be the best fit for the Guam Legislature, including the Guam Congress Building and all covered external legislative offices. Alternate approaches, including a hub-and-spoke model, may be proposed provided the solution satisfies the RFP's requirements for secure connectivity, centralized management, resiliency, monitoring, scalability, and integration with Legislature systems.**

Offerors shall clearly identify the proposed architecture, assumptions, dependencies, required third-party services, compatibility considerations, and any limitations or risks associated with the solution. The proposed approach will be evaluated based on its overall suitability for the Legislature's operational, technical, and cybersecurity requirements.

- 3) Kindly confirm Term of Service: 12 months, 24 months? Response 07/17/26:**
Please find the details for the Guam Legislative Terms and Fiscal Years outlined below:

38th Guam Legislature: (2 Years)

Fiscal Year (FY) 2026: October 2025 – September 2026

Fiscal Year (FY) 2027: October 2026 – December 31, 2026

39th Guam Legislature (2 Years):

Fiscal Year (FY) 2027: January 2027 – September 2027

Fiscal Year (FY) 2028: October 2027 – September 30, 2028

Fiscal Year (FY) 2029: October 2028 – December 2028

Please note the Legislative Terms are for a 24-month period (2) Years, based on availability of funding.

Question 4:

- 4) Kindly advise whether High Availability (HA) is required.**

Response 07/17/26: The RFP does not prescribe a specific High Availability configuration, such as active-active equipment, redundant circuits, or clustered systems, as a universal requirement for every system or covered location. Offerors are responsible for proposing the architecture they determine is best suited to meet the Guam Legislature's operational continuity, reliability, security, and service-level requirements.

Where High Availability, redundancy, or failover is technically and commercially feasible, or is necessary for the proposed solution to meet its stated availability and continuity objectives, the Offeror should include and clearly describe those capabilities. The proposal shall identify any associated equipment, circuits, licensing, third-party services, assumptions, dependencies, limitations, and implementation impacts.

The adequacy of the Offeror's proposed availability, redundancy, failover, and continuity approach will be considered under the applicable evaluation criteria, including Technical Approach and Architecture and Managed Services Capability and Continuity Model.

Question 6:

- 6) Please confirm if the provider will be required to install their own racks. Response 07/17/26: Yes. Offerors may propose, furnish, and install communication racks, cabinets, cable-management components, and other equipment reasonably necessary to implement their proposed solution at the Guam Congress Building, within a proposed colocation environment, and at covered external legislative offices, as applicable to the proposed architecture.**

All onsite rack locations, equipment locations, cable routes, mounting arrangements, and related physical installations shall be subject to assessment, site conditions, and MIS review and approval before installation. For any proposed colocation solution, the Offeror shall identify the rack space, power, connectivity, security, hosting, support, and third-party dependencies required to operate the proposed environment.

Equipment deployed at external legislative offices shall be designed and documented as a standardized, portable or relocatable office network stack where practical, consistent with the RFP. Offerors shall clearly describe how the proposed equipment can be disconnected, relocated, reconnected, and reintegrated with centralized Legislature services during an office move.

All necessary racks, cabinets, equipment, installation materials, licensing, hosting, colocation, and related implementation costs may be identified as part of the proposed solution. Any costs shall be separately identified and submitted in the format and at the stage required by the RFP and Procurement.

Question 7:

7) Please advise on the expected delivery timeline. Additionally, please confirm whether installation will be required during weekends or after-hours.

Response 07/17/26: The RFP does not establish a single maximum delivery or implementation period because proposed solutions, equipment requirements, carrier dependencies, and deployment approaches may differ among Offerors. Each Offeror shall propose a reasonable, achievable, and well-supported implementation schedule for the Guam Congress Building and all covered external legislative offices.

The proposed schedule shall identify equipment and circuit lead times, site assessments, installation phases, testing, cutover, acceptance milestones, external-office deployments, third-party dependencies, and anticipated completion dates. Any known supply-chain, shipping, permitting, carrier, subcontractor, or other conditions that may affect implementation shall be clearly disclosed.

Offerors may not assume that an unsupported, excessive, or open-ended implementation period will be accepted. The reasonableness, feasibility, completeness, and continuity impacts of the proposed schedule will be considered under the applicable evaluation criteria. The final implementation schedule, milestones, and acceptance requirements will be subject to Legislature approval and incorporated into the resulting contract.
